TUESDAY:

READ: Hebrews 4:12-13

This week we will uncover the power found in God's Word. Today's passage reveals several truths that indicate the Bible is more than just a heavy book on the shelf. Answer the questions below:

- Q: How is God's Word described in this passage?
- Q: Which description of the Bible sticks out the most and why?
- Q: Verse 13 tells us God sees everything. How is this both comforting and convicting?
- Q: What do you think it will be like to stand before the Lord one day?

WEDNESDAY

READ: 1 John 1:5-10

God is pure and fellowship with Him requires walking in the light. To walk in the light we must acknowledge our sins, confess and seek restoration. Not doing these things implies His Word hasn't sunk into our hearts.

Answer the questions below:

- Q: Light and dark - what does this contrast imply about God and sin?
- Q: Explain three ways someone can live out the truth of God's Word.
- Q: What sins do you need to acknowledge and confess to the Lord today?
- Q: What does verse 9 tell us is the benefit to confession?

THURSDAY

READ: Romans 10:9-15

Believing in Jesus means we'll never be put to shame. So why do we feel embarrassed by our faith at times? Despite our insecurities, the Gospel message needs to be shared. Answer the questions below:

- Q: What does verse 12 tell us about salvation being available to all people?
- Q: What role do you play in sharing the message of Jesus with people around you?
- Q: What is an obstacle in sharing the Gospel? What is an excuse? What's the difference?
- Q: Who will you share Jesus with when you return home? Write out a quick prayer over the individual(s).

FRIDAY

READ: James 2:14-17

Spiritual growth that happens at camp is meant to propel you into greater obedience as you return home. Write down three specific things the Lord taught you this week and how you plan to apply those truths to your life. Spend time intentionally praying over each action item.
